

The IB has identified 6 global contexts in the MYP:



You will need to choose one of these 6 global contexts in order to contextualize your research and your reflection. You may want to consider the following questions as you decide to identify a global context for your goal:

What do I want to achieve through my personal project?

What do I want others to understand through my work?

What sort of action will my project develop; will it engage me in service?

What impact do I want my project to have?

What is it about the context I choose that will allow me to create a more focused project?

Identities and relationships

- a) Is it a project about yourself?
- b) Is it a project about who you are as an individual?
- c) Is it a project about your background?
- d) Is it a project about your identity?
- e) Is it a project about beliefs?
- f) Is it an exploration of social values?
- g) Does your project address aspects of human relationships?
- h) Does your project address aspects of certain communities and/or cultures?
- i) Does your project address aspects of people's rights and responsibilities?
- j) Does your project address what it means to be human?

Orientation in space and time

- a) Is your project an exploration about personal histories?
- b) Does your project address how people, places, beliefs or values have experienced change?
- c) Does your project address aspects of people's journeys?
- d) Does your project address aspects of people's migration?
- e) Does your project address the connection between individual, civilizations and the place in which they live?
- f) Does your project address the nature of people and civilizations considering local and global perspectives?

Personal and cultural expression

- a) Does your project address aspects of the way you express your ideas?
- b) Does your project address aspects of the way you express your feelings?
- c) Does your project address aspects of the way you express yourself as a human being?
- d) Does your project address aspects of how you express your culture (including your cultural identity)?
- e) Does your project address aspects of different media you employ to express your beliefs and values?
- f) Does your project address the way in which you reflect about your creativity?
- g) Is your project an exploration of your creativity?
- h) Does your project address aspects of how you or people around you appreciate the aesthetic?

Scientific and technical innovation

- a) Does your project address aspects of the natural world?
- b) Does your project address aspects of one or several science laws?
- c) Does your project address the relationship between nature and society?
- d) Does your project address the interaction between the physical and biological world?
- e) Through your project, do you attempt to show how you understand certain principles of science or technology?
- f) Through your project, do you attempt to explore the impact of scientific and technological advances on society or the environment?

Globalization and sustainability

- a) Through your project, do you attempt to look at how human communities are connected?
- b) Through your project, do you attempt to look at how human systems are organized or managed?
- c) Through your project, do you attempt to study how people or societies make decisions?
- d) Through your project, do you attempt to study economic activities?
- e) Through your project, do you attempt to study the impact of economic activities?
- f) Through your project, do you attempt to study how the environment is affected by human activities?

Fairness and development

- b) Through your project, do you attempt to look at human rights and responsibilities regarding environment conservation?
